There is a rare breed of people who always rise above the rest. Wherever you place them, they shine. Whenever you give them an opportunity to lead, they become primus inter pares - first among equals.

This has been the story of Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi - the quintessential leader's leader. Even as a student activist during his undergraduate days studying English literature at the University of Port Harcourt, he was elected by his peers as National President of the National Union of Rivers State Students (NURSS). Through this platform, he organized, coordinated and advocated for the interests of Rivers States students in all tertiary institutions across Nigeria.

Fast forward several years and the young student leader had not only ascended to a seat in the Rivers State House of Assembly, but he was the unanimous choice amongst elected legislators to become the Speaker. He then became the first and only ever two-term Speaker of the House in Rivers State, presiding over a highly productive Legislature (even winning an award for the most productive State of Assembly in Nigeria from the Nigerian Union of Journalists in 2000), as he worked closely with the Executive to drive positive change in the state. No other Nigerian Speaker has ever presided over the State House of Assembly for an unbroken period of 8 years.

Amaechi's outstanding leadership and tenure as State Speaker also led to him being elected by his peers as the pioneer Chairman, Conference of Speakers of State Assemblies in November 2000. He also held this position for a record two terms because of the confidence and trust that his fellow Speakers from across Nigeria had in him.

When he was Governor of Rivers State, Amaechi's outstanding leadership skills saw him rise to the top again, as his fellow Governors elected him Chairman of the Nigerian Governors Forum in 2011, and re-elected him in 2013 for another two years. As Chairman of the Nigerian Governors Forum, Amaechi proved himself to be a bi-partisan leader who brought the governors together, advocated for their interests and always took a stand against irregularities in government. As a Minister, Amaechi is widely regarded as a "super minister", not only because he has been appointed twice by Buhari to helm one of the most strategic portfolios in government, but also because his loyalty and hard work has earned him the respect, confidence and admiration of the President. Even Amaechi's detractors will agree that he has been the best performing Minister and he is also the first individual to have been awarded the best Minister of the Decade by This Day Newspapers

Throughout his political career, despite the cut-throat, territorial and ambitious world of politics, Amaechi has emerged time and time again as the first among equals, crowned by his colleagues to oversee and direct their collective interests. This would not be possible if he did not have the kind of values, temperament and ability that inspire trust and motivate even his peers to fall behind him. The most important attribute of any President is capacity to govern. This capacity comes from both personal disposition and experience. Presidential elections in Nigeria attract a host of candidates, many of whom enter the race with the erroneous assumption that because they have reached a level of success in their private business or careers, they should be eminently qualified for the highest office in the land. While any Nigerian can aspire to lead his or her country, it is hard to come in from the outside and start at the top.

Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi did not start at the top. From humble beginnings, he has climbed through the ranks, each time promoted by his mentors, peers and constituents to seek higher office. Unlike most who will emerge as pretenders to the Office of the President, he has served in both the legislative and executive arms of government and also at all levels of government - local, state and federal.

Experience in governance important. As the Brookings Institute, the famed U.S. Think-tank notes: "Politics is a difficult job, and experience matters... knowing the ropes in government, building political capital, and learning to navigate political cross-currents take time." Few Presidential hopefuls in the history of Nigeria have ever had the breadth of political experience of Amaechi. From local government to State House of Assembly to Governor and Minister, the rich practical experience he has gained in the trenches cannot be discounted or downplayed. While other candidates will ask the voters to believe in them based on manifestos or what local parlance may call "big grammar", Amaechi can point to a record of performance at every level of government that can withstand any scrutiny and has drawn numerous accolades at home and abroad.

His first official political office was as Secretary of the now defunct National Republican Convention in Ikwerre Local Government Area of Rivers State. Then he was appointed Special Assistant to then Deputy Governor (and future Governor) of Rivers State, Peter Odili between 1992 and 1994. He also served as the Rivers State Secretaryof the Democratic Party of Nigeria (DPN); Caretaker Committee, in 1996, during the transition programme of General Sani Abacha.

As the State Speaker of the House in the Rivers State Assembly, he presided over a period of unprecedented harmony and fruitful working relations between the Legislature and the Executive. In a stark departure from previous eras, the relationship was conflict-free, the State House and the Executive worked hand in hand to pass laws and enact policy that promoted the wellbeing of the people.

As the Governor of Rivers State the "Treasure Base of Nigeria,", Amaechi became Chief Executive of one of the most strategic states of the Federation - second only to Akwa Ibom in oil production and second to Lagos in terms of internally generated revenue (IGR) averaging N10 Billion in monthly accruals. He was in charge of leading a population of 5.1 million people, supervising 50,000 public servants, managing relationships with traditional rulers, oil companies, foreign alliances, other state Governments and of course the Federal Government.

As the Governor of Rivers State Amaechi was in charge of



At the time he took office, River State was beset by many challenges including escalating violence, crumbling infrastructure, a dilapidated school system and weary citizens. He brought the experience he had gained as the two-time Speaker of the State House of Assembly to bear as a Governor - building bi-partisan relationships, implementing bold ideas and leading from the front. His administration invested massively in infrastructure development, construction of roads and bridges, modernization of transportation services and the urban renewal of the Garden Citv.

When he moved to the Federal level, his experience driving growth and development and executing largescale infrastructure and transportation projects in Rivers State, meant he was able to hit the ground running as Minister. He has now been a twoterm Minister overseeing arguably the most impactful portfolio. Transportation is cross-cutting and permeates many economic sectors, facilitates international trade, supports food security, delivers energy and enables industrial and infrastructural development. It generates employment and helps create prosperity, thereby fulfilling critical economic as well as social functions.

As far as Nigeria's unity is concerned, Amaechi has demonstrated his disposition to the oneness and unity of Nigeria through his advocacies concerning the indivisibility of Nigeria.

As APC prepares to conduct the primaries to choose the party's flagbearer, they must pay attention to all the geopolitical factors at play. Understandably, there is a strong push for power to shift to the South in 2023 and specifically to the Igbos. Igbos have not been at the centre since the Second Republic more than 40 years ago, when late Alex Ekwueme was Vice President in the Shehu Shagari Administration. Not surprisingly there is loud agitation from the Igbos that they should have their turn to lead the government.

Other groups are also pleading the case of the Igbos in the name of equity and the stability of the country. Leader of Pan Yoruba sociopolitical group, Afenifere, Chief Ayo Adebanjo, has warned that Igbos should produce the president in 2023 election, if Nigeria hopes to enjoy peace. The Association of Arewa Community in Igboland has also urged Nigerians to consent to an Igbo becoming the President of the country in 2023. Chibuike Amaechi is an Igbo man of Ikwerre stock. His hometown Ubima is on the border of Imo State and the fact that Nigeria's modern geopolitical map places it in the South-South region does not change the fact that Ikwerre are a dialectical group of the Igbo nation. By ethnicity, language and heritage, Amaechi is no less Igbo than a man from Abriba, Owerri, Ebonyi, Awka or Enugu-Ukwu.

In addition, he also has the unique advantage of being not only Igbo but a Niger Deltan. This means that Amaechi could also find favour with those currently insisting that the next President should come from the South-South on the basis that their region only completed one elected term under President R. Goodluck Jonathan. There are some in other parts of the country who may find it more politically expedient to throw their lot behind a South-South candidate than behind a "traditional" Igbo man.

In February 2022, Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi was turbanned as the Dan Amanar of Daura. In Hausa dialect, Dan Amanar is used in reference to someone that is trustworthy, of noble character and carriage, a confidant and one whose words can be relied upon.

As much as Amaechi's tribe and geo-political zone give him an advantage, he also has the advantage of being a candidate who is a true national figure - recognized all over Nigeria, with friends and allies across the length and breadth of the country. Some people vying for office also have recognizable names but are identified so resolutely with their tribe or zone that they cannot be effective national consensus candidates. Few of Amaechi's contenders have had the same opportunity or share the same disposition that allows him to travel to every state of the Federation, forge alliances and build relationships.

Beloved by his people in the Niger Delta, he is also embraced by the South East as a true Igbo son and lauded in the South West for providing the Lagos - Ibadan railway system which has been a source of pride and renewed economic activity in the region. The North see him as a friend, a truly detribalized Nigerian who does not discriminate against tribe or religion and who has worked tirelessly to support President Muhammadu Buhari. In fact, the core of his promoters to be Buhari's successor, are leading political elements from Northern Nigeria.

Amaechi has a thorough understanding of the complexities of the nation - the challenges of balancing the interests and influences in a country of different persuasions, traditions, cultures, religions.

While others fan the flames of ethnic tension for their own selfish political advantage, Amaechi has consistently championed national unity, identifying ethnic divisiveness as an obstacle to progress. For example, as Minister of Transportation, he has fought against what he calls the "politicization of railway development" as a major challenge to the progress of the work. Undaunted by the base instincts of his detractors, he has kept to his course, arguing correctly that economic interest not ethnic bias should be the deciding factor for rail projects around the country.



Nigerians are too ethnically conscious. You think first as your ethnicity before you think as a Nigerian. We have very few Nigerians, and ethnicity is putting pressure on the economics of railway construction."

Over his many years in governance, Amaechi has always proved himself to be a staunch nationalist, refusing to discriminate against anyone on the basis of tribe. For example, during his time as Governor of Rivers State, non-indigenes in the state did not experience the usual discrimination that had occurred previously and that continues in most states, whereby so-called indigenes of a state enjoy greater benefits. Amaechi completely dismantled the idea of non-indigene status. He recruited more than 3000 non-Riverians into the State workforce - an unprecedented action. He also cancelled the long-standing practice of non-indigenes being charged higher school fees than state indigenes. Instead he introduced a flat rate for all residents of the State, no matter their birth place.

In February 2022, Amaechi was conferred with the traditional title of Dan Amanar Daura by His Royal Highness Emir of Daura, Alhaji (Dr.) Umar Farouq Umar CON, ruler of one of the leading Emirates in Nigeria. The title Dan Amanar in Hausa means "The Trustworthy Son" or the "Confidante" of Daura - someone of noble character; a man whose words can be relied on. This most fitting title celebrates not only his personal qualities but also the high esteem with which Amaechi is held by the people of Daura, for his service to their most famous son President Muhammad Buhari and for bringing unparalleled investment into the community, with the siting of the \$50 million Federal University of Transport Technology in Daura, which he negotiated to be built for free by the Chinese railway contractors.

To pigeon-hole Amaechi as merely a South-South politician would be to woefully underestimate his national reach and relevance. He was a wellrecognized national figure even before this current Administration and since 2015, he has spent the last 7 years criss-crossing Nigeria, delivering infrastructural development to people from North to South as Minister of Transport. These state visits have grown his own personal political capital and networks.

His antecedents prove that Amaechi has the character, inclusive heart and nationalist vision that Nigeria needs at this sensitive time in her history. On the burning questions of restructuring and calls for self-determination by various groups, he maintains a respectful stance towards the heartfelt position of those who question our unity. But he always advocates a firmly pan-Nigerian agenda, counselling against disintegration and preaching the value of unity in diversity.

There are many reasons why a candidate may choose to run for President - distinguished service in career or business, encouragement by followers or sycophants, desire to serve or simply personal ambition. But deciding to run for office is not the same thing as having the capacity to win.

Many candidates begin electoral campaigns without any concrete strategy or clear path to victory. Instead they make assumptions based on their perceived popularity, the size of their pockets and the overly optimistic view of their supporters. Or they assume that their previous success in other arenas such as business or political appointments has given them all the qualifications necessary to run for office.

However campaigning for elected office is a far cry from leading a company or carrying out the duties of an appointed public official. Politicking is a skill that comes from experience on ground, in the field and it cannot be learned overnight.

Amaechi is both a distinguished public servant and a consummate

politician. Even his success as a Minister overseeing the high-profile Ministry of Transportation, owes as much to his deep understanding of politics as to his impressive managerial capabilities. In a politically charged and complex nation like Nigeria, there is real value in having a politician at the helm. Someone who is able to navigate the murky waters of partisanship, who has the experience to foresee challenges before they arise and who simply knows how the game is played. Other candidates may be highly competent as technocrats or business leaders, but they have limited experience in the political arena.

As a seasoned politician, Amaechi knows how to balance expectations and meet the needs of competing interests so that both sides feel accommodated. He did this expertly as Speaker of the State House of Assembly, Rivers State when the traditionally thorny relationship between the legislature and the Executive - then Governor Peter Odili became unusually harmonious and productive.

He also has proven capacity to withstand political pressure and fight his corner. Ambitious opponents have tried to thwart Amaechi's progress every step of the way and he has seen them off successfully at every turn. In 2003, when the National Assembly tried to undermine the legislative functions of the State House of Assembly, Amaechi, as Chairman of the Speakers of State Assembly, led his colleagues into action. They took the matter to court and received a historic Supreme Court judgment that affirmed that the control and supervision of local governments is under the purview of the State House of Assembly. Then in 2007, when rivals tried to rob him of the PDP Primary ticket, he took the case to court and scored another victory when he was declared winner of the April 2007 Governorship election in Rivers State. This was not only a victory for him, but for democracy in Nigeria.

Whenever crisis brews, Amaechi has proved himself bold, politically astute and able to build the right coalitions to achieve victory. When relations between Amaechi and then-President Goodluck Jonathan and the ruling PDP turned sour, he did not bow to the intense pressure from the Administration to kowtow to the President's demands nor did he retreat to the background. Instead he formed a break-away group with five other PDP governors, which ultimately led to the creation of a new party - the All Progressives Congress (APC). The broad national alliances that Amaechi had built up over the years, his doggedness and political savvy made him the obvious choice to be appointed Director-General of the 2015 Muhammadu Buhari Presidential Election campaign. He was able to mobilize massive crosscountry support for the APC candidate and eventual winner, achieving the unprecedented feat of unseating an incumbent President. Even in more mature democracies such as the U.S.. incumbent politicians achieve re-election rates as high as 90%, because they are better able to control the narrative. command press attention and benefit enormously from the resources of their office. Amaechi as DG of the Muhammadu Buhari Presidential Campaign became one of the few Africans to lead a presidential campaign that ousted a ruling party from power.

Success breeds more work, so not surprisingly, Buhari turned to Amaechi again in 2019 to lead his re-election campaign. As he had done four years earlier, Amaechi delivered on the task at hand, helping to secure a second term for President Buhari. Amaechi knows how to move the levers of power, how to build coalitions and how to mobilize people en masse. He knows how to win.

The success of a President resides not only in his experience or knowledge but in who he is as an individual. As we have seen in global leaders throughout history, it is often the most personal attributes - temperament, age, personality, stamina - that enable or limit progress. Research also shows that the personality of political leaders has an impact on their success in office - from policy accomplishments, relationships with the legislative branch, use of executive orders and the likelihood of negative behaviours. As author and leadership guru Steven Covey notes: **"Leadership has two sides what a person is - character and what a person does - competence."**

Amaechi has high expectations of those who work with him because he holds himself to similarly high standards. Known as the workaholic Minister, anybody who has served under Amaechi will attest to the fact that he gives 110% to every task. As soon as he took charge of the Minister of Transportation, his first approach was to carry out a "human capacity audit" to ascertain the strength and weakness of the management staff. While some Ministers remain cocooned in their offices, appearing only for public functions, Amaechi keeps his staff on their toes by paying surprise visits to offices of the various parastatals within the Ministry, catching out those who are slacking on the job and motivating the workforce to apply themselves more fully to their jobs.

Amaechi is not a man who governs from afar or issues orders from behind the closed doors of his office. He is a handson leader, down to earth and closely involved in day to day running of affairs. In his time as Rivers State Governor, he knew the location of every project and would conduct inspections of capital projects, even at night, so relentless was his drive to get the job done.

He is also a true servant leader who understands that he is employed by and for the Nigerian people and it is to them that he must ultimately answer. In contrast to the opaque activities of many political leaders, Amaechi has always favoured open and transparent government. During his tenure in Rivers State, he made the office of Governor more approachable than ever before and established a participatory-style government, maintaining constant communication with the people.

He is not too proud to receive criticism, solicit feedback or ask for help. In fact he actively welcomes it. When Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi came to office in 2007, Rivers State was under siege from various factions of Niger Delta militants engaging in all manner of violent crime from blowing up pipelines to kidnapping innocent citizens. A climate of fear prevailed in Port Harcourt and the insecurity had forced the closure of local businesses, as well as the departure of several multinationals and wouldbe investors from the state. Amaechi knew that his ambitious agenda to modernize and rebuild the state's decaying infrastructure could never gain traction if he didn't take control of the security situation. He made the restoration of law and order his number one priority.

Backed by the late President Umaru Yar' Adua, he launched a major military offensive in December 2007 which snuffed out militia group leaders like Ateke Tom and loosened the grip of the militants on the State. He made sure that the security agencies had all the support they needed from the State government in terms of equipment, resources and logistics - even sending the anti terror squad to Israel for training.

Amaechi built capacity in the state security system by establishing an integrated Security Network, with a central Command, Control, Communication, Computer and Intelligence (C4I) and a 24-Hour Camera System that watched over Port Harcourt City. His security architecture for the State was the best in the nation and by 2009, Amaechi's zero tolerance policy against banditry and militants had effectively driven out the militias.

Amaechi transformed Rivers State from a hotbed of insecurity into one of the most peaceful states in Nigeria, bringing kidnapping, armed robbery and cult-related activities down to less than one percent. Under Amaechi, the formerly violence-torn state became known as the state "where you sleep with your two eyes closed.

As soon as Amaechi took office he declared a state of emergency on education. Years of neglect had resulted in dilapidated and overcrowded schools filled with children sitting on the floor because there were no desks. Passionate about education and perhaps because he was the only one of his 8 siblings who his father could afford to send to university, he was determined that no child would be left behind in Rivers State when it came to education.

EDUCATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Amaechi began by tackling the huge infrastructural deficiencies in the educational sector. Over the course of his 8 years in office, his Administration built 350 new model primary schools in almost every community across the State - a pace of school development unparalleled anywhere in Africa. Each of these model primary





Rivers State under Amaechi became the first state in Nigeria to introduce the study of ICT at the primary school level. All schools were equipped with ICT facilities and internet connection. In addition, all pupils were provided with free uniforms, free school sandals, free school bags and free textbooks another first in Nigeria.



Amaechi also constructed 24 model secondary schools across the 23 local government areas, featuring world-class education. recreational and boarding facilities. complete with quality teachers housing.



At the tertiary level, the State established a new University of Education and built a modern 6,000 bed student hostel, along with accommodation for lecturers at the Rivers State University of Science and Technology. The University also benefited from huge investment in ICT to enhance student learning and improve academic administration. Thanks to these efforts, Rivers State University of Science and Technology skyrocketed in national educational rankings from 79th to the Best State University in Nigeria and 12th overall Best University.

FOREIGN SCHOLARSHIPS

Believing firmly in the role of education in national growth and development, Amaechi sent more than 3,500 Rivers State indigenes and residents on scholarship to top universities around the world to study ICT, Medicine, Science, Engineering and more. While at home, he catered to the capacity needs of the self-employed and entrepreneur population by building skills acquisitions centres to train them.

TEACHERS TRAINING & EMPLOYMENT

Recognizing the need to build capacity amongst the teaching ranks, Amaechi embarked on an ambitious teacher retraining and recertification program in partnership with the British Council. Then, in an unprecedented move, in stark contrast to other States where Governors were cutting Local Government funds, he ordered the State to take over the payment of teacher salaries from the local governments. Although this cost the State about N2bn per month, he realized that leaving things as they were, with Local Governments in charge of paying teachers, the problems of non-payment of salaries, teacher strikes, low teacher quality and loss of teachers would continue. Amaechi was determined to improve the quality and professionalism of teachers in the State. His Administration also employed more than 13,000 teachers - an unparalleled feat - which greatly improved teacherpupil ratios in schools.

SUSTAINABILITY MEASURES

Finally, with an eye on sustainability, Amaechi championed the signing of five new laws including the Rivers State Universal Basic Education Amendment Bill 2012 and the Rivers State Senior Secondary Schools' Board Bill 2012. He campaigned heavily for and signed into a law a social service levy to be paid by all employed and self-employed residents of Rivers State. The funds from this levy would be pooled to fund the free education programs, improvements in medical facilities and other essential social services.

INTERNATIONAL & LOCAL RECOGNITION

Not surprisingly, the educational revolution in Rivers State attracted huge national and international acclaim. The State twice won the UBEC Award for Best State in Education Development; Rivers State Government was judged the best performing state in the Education sector within the South-South zone and the Rivers State Ministry of Education won the Babs Fafunwa Education Prize for Service Delivery.

UNESCO recognized Rivers State for the Administration's huge strides in improving education and then in 2012, the City of Port Harcourt was voted, won and declared "World Book Capital 2014". Port Harcourt was the first City in Sub-Saharan Africa to win World Book Capital, beating 10 other contenders including cities like Oxford, Moscow and Lyons. In further recognition of his accomplishments in the education sector. Amaechi was appointed onto the Board of Directors of the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR); and subsequently recognized and honoured as a Passport-carrying Ambassador of the United Nations.

Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi completely transformed healthcare infrastructure and delivery in Rivers State during his tenure. To bring quality healthcare to as many people as possible, his Administration constructed more than 160 primary health centres in almost every ward in the state. He also built modern medical centres of excellence such as the Prof. Kelsey Harrison Hospital and the N2 billion world-class Rivers State Dental and Maxillofacial Hospital in Port Harcourt, as well as starting construction on a new world-class School of Nursing before leaving office.



Amaechi employed 600 doctors, gave them official cars and wellfurnished accommodation - a first in the history of Rivers state. Most importantly, the new health facilities delivered free services to both indigenes and nonindigenes resident in the State. To safeguard the sustainability of the healthcare projects, he pushed for the passage of the bill establishing the Management of Primary Healthcare Board in 2010. This was to support the establishment of an organizational framework for effective management of the Model Health Centres across the state.



AGRICULTURE



Amaechi worked to revive the lagging agricultural sector to tackle food security, create new job opportunities and diversify the economy from over-dependency on crude oil. His government collaborated with the renowned Songhai Farm in Republic of Benin, to establish the 314-hectare Songhai Rivers Initiative Farm. This integrated farm combined livestock, arable farming, fisheries, snail farming and poultry in Bunu-Tai, Rivers State. This also led to the employment and training of young Rivers men and women in new farming methods, boosting productivity with innovative technologies in agriculture.

Other accomplishments in agriculture include:

Acquisition of 2,000 hectares of land in Ogoni for cultivation, production and export of banana in partnership with Mexican firm San Carlos Nigeria Limited

Development of modern fish farms with the capacity to harvest up to 1000 tonnes per year from one facility Agreement between the Government of Rivers State and SIAT Nigeria Ltd for the rehabilitation and replanting of the moribund 16,000 hectares Risonpalm estate (more than 14,000 hectares had been rehabilitated during his Administration) and rehabilitation of the 7,000 hectare Delta Rubber Company Limited.



URBAN RENEWAL

Port Harcourt and its environs received a much needed face lift under the Amaechi Administration. He created the Greater Port Harcourt City Master plan that included the expansion and integration of new parts of the city. He tackled the housing shortage by seeking partnership with First Bank of Nigeria to build the 1000 unit Rainbow Town Estate and others that continued after he left office. He also developed non-residential properties such as the Adokiye Amiesimaka stadium and the planned new Rivers State University of Science and Technology. His efforts were honoured by the United Nations World Habitat with an Award "for providing affordable houses and developing habitable cities as well as providing basic amenities in Rivers State, Nigeria."





To tackle the excruciating traffic the responsibility of rehabilitating Federal roads instead of waiting for congestion in Port Harcourt, Amaechi expanded several key the central government, investing roads - such as Rumuokuta-Choba as much as N108 billion.He also East-West road and Obi Akpo constructed Eleme junction flyover. roads - into dual carriage ways and constructed more than 890 kilometres of roads, more than all his predecessors combined. POWER



Amaechi built two new power stations in Afam and expanded the Omoku and Trans-Amadi power stations. This intervention increased the State's power generation from a low of 70MW (20% utilization in 2007) to 700MW by the time he left office in 2015, a record high of 77 percent utilization. Under Amaechi, Rivers State became the highest independent power generation centre in Nigeria, second only to the Federal Government. He also built seven transmission stations and distribution injection sub-stations. To mitigate the debilitating impact of erratic power supply, his government sought out private sector operators and sold 70 percent equity stake in power generating assets, at premium prices to NG Power HPS.

Always visionary and thinking about the best possible deal for his constituents, he began talks with the Federal Government to allow Rivers State to distribute its own power to ensure regular power supply to its citizens.





ARTS, CULTURE & TOURISM



Amaechi revitalized the Garden City Literary Festival and turned it into an international annual event which drew literary scholars, authors and intellectuals from around the world. The Festival explored ways to improve society through literature and encourage a reading culture amongst the people. He also revived the huge Christmas cultural event - CARNIRIV - giving residents an opportunity to relax, attracting tourism into the State and boosting the local economy.

President Buhari came into power determined to leave a legacy when it came to infrastructure and revitalization of the transport sector. His vision was to establish an integrated national transportation backbone combining railways, waterways and roads, to give people the ability to move around easily, enhance trade and open up new vistas for economic growth.

The fact that President Buhari appointed Chibuike Amaechi as Minister of Transportation and has retained him in that role since the beginning of his Administration speaks volumes about how highly he regards Amaechi's capabilities, commitment and drive.

The importance of the transport sector cannot be overstated. It is a sector that affects all sectors and is essential for economic and social development, helping link products to markets, facilitating the flow of goods and people, promoting regional and national integration and expanding the country's economic progress.

As Minister of the Federal Ministry of Transportation, Amaechi's key responsibilities are to:



To provide direction for transportation policy and control.

To supervise and monitor and ensure that transportation policies are implemented.



To formulate relevant transportation laws for the generality of Nigerians.

To carry out the auditing of management of all the eight parastatals under its management.



To liaise with the Ministry of Aviation and other ministries because it cannot achieve success in isolation. Amaechi's Ministry embarked on huge transport infrastructure investment across the country to ensure efficiency in the transportation sector. These interventions include extensive construction of roads. rail lines with access roads, inland water ports, seaports, new terminals in existing ports, dry ports with access to rail and roads, inland container depots/ freight all geared towards building a modern and efficient transportation system that guarantees sustainable socio-economic development of Nigeria, regional integration and trade liberalisation.











MANY NIGERIANS HAVE ASKED WHY THE CONSTRUCTION OF RAILWAYS.

Eighty percent of the cargoes we have in Nigeria are imported because the Nigerian economy is yet to generate enough production. However, the President is of the view that if we must produce, we must have infrastructure that enables that production, hence the focus on transportation, power and works.





Despite numerous obstacles ranging from severe challenges securing finance, to unforeseen delays caused by COVID-19, and of course dealing with the political machinations that surround such a high-profile, capital intensive sector, Amaechi has made remarkable strides as Minister of Transportation.

Standard gauge rail lines are being built and existing narrow gauge lines reconstructed, while modern and faster locomotive trains, coaches and wagons have been introduced, including containerised freight wagons. He flagged-off freight services on the Itakpe-Warri rail corridor and haulage of pipeline materials for the AKK gas pipeline project. He supervised the completion of the Abuja-Kaduna rail line, secured the contract for the Lagos-Ibadan-Kano rail line, and has delivered the Lagos-Ibadan section with massive state-of-the-art train stations with an extension of the line into the seaport in Apapa. He completed the Warri-Itakpe rail line and kickstarted the Kano-Kaduna rail line. Kano-Maradi rail line and Port Harcourt-Maiduguri rail line.

The Lagos-Ibadan rail line is a double-track standard gauge rail. the first of its kind in the West African sub-region. More than 40,000 passengers ride on the train monthly, enjoying safe and comfortable passage between the two cities. with stops at 11 modern terminals along the way. In addition to making it easier for people to travel between these two economic centres, the Lagos-Ibadan rail line has enabled goods to be transported right from Apapa Port to the Inland Container Depots in Ibadan, from where they can be distributed to other parts of the country.



Construction is underway on some critical routes:

Ibadan-Kano

Abuja- Lokoja

Lagos-Calabar

Abuja-Itakpe which will link the existing Itakpe-Delta rail line

There are also three major railway projects that have been flagged off and are awaiting to gather more funding to start. The Chinese banks who had initially backed the railway projects are no longer forthcoming with funding and so the Transportation ministry led by Amaechi is negotiating with other foreign banks to ensure that these projects do not stall.

- Kano Kaduna: Ground-breaking for the 204 km standard gauge railway between Abuja and Kaduna took place in July 2021 and it will form part of the 1343km Kano-Abuja railway project.
- Port Harcourt Maiduguri Line: In March 2021, the Federal Government flagged off the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the Eastern railway line, originating from Port Harcourt and terminating in Maiduguri. This 1,443 kilometer line is part of an integrated transportation plan that will also link up the Bonny Deep Seaport and the Port Harcourt Railway Industrial Park, thereby revitalizing economic activities along the Eastern corridor and easing the shipment of cargo and freight locally across the West African sub-region and in the Continental Free Trade Area. When complete, the Port Harcourt-Maiduguri railway line is expected to move about 11 million tonnes of cargo.
- Kano Maradi Line: This \$1.8bn railway track being built by Portuguese construction company Mota-Engil will link Nigeria and Niger Republic. This route will boost intra-regional trade, giving Nigeria an outlet to export its produce and products to Niger and providing Niger with a safe route into Nigeria to transport her oil to Europe.

MODERNIZATION OF PAYMENT SYSTEMS

In January 2021, Amaechi launched the first-of-its-kind e-ticketing platform called Transport Payment Solution (TPS), providing automation of ticket sales on the Abuja-Kaduna train service, making Nigeria the first nation in Africa with a global transportation e-ticketing solution. Passengers can obtain digital tickets by downloading the NRC e-ticketing app or using the PoS terminals at the various train stations. Amaechi supervised this N900 Million Public-Private Partnership with Lagos-based company Secure ID. In the maritime sector, Amaechi has commissioned, upgraded and rebuilt key maritime assets. He has been working to modernize the nation's ports, improve communication, stem operational challenges and enhance both safety and security.

Among several notable achievements is the commissioning of the Command, Control, Communication and Intelligence System (CCCIS) which provides business intelligence for the movement of vessels and cargoes. Another is the establishment of the Ultra-Modern Marine and Harbour Simulation Centre at Dockyard Apapa to build capacity of ports operations personnel, attract bigger vessels to our ports and improve efficiency. This Simulation Centre also gives the Ministry the ability to deliver sophisticated training locally, thereby saving on the typically high cost of sending staff abroad for this level of training.

PORTS CONSTRUCTION

Amaechi has executed largescale infrastructure projects that will expand Nigeria's maritime trade potential and open up the economy. The Onitsha River Port has been concessioned and the Lekki DeepSea port construction is on schedule to be commissioned in last quarter of 2022, with approximately 80 percent of the project already completed by January this year. Work has also begun on the marine services jetty, which the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA) will use to provide marine services for the operations of the port. This world-class port will include tug bots, pilot boats, Vessel Tracking System, 300 truck parking area. full Customs examination bav and dedicated area for impounded goods. Upon completion, Lekki DeepSea Port will become a regional distribution and transshipment hub for the whole of Africa.



Amaechi is constructing more deepsea ports in Onne, Rivers and Warri, Delta State. Construction of the Bonny Deep Seaport will run concurrently with the construction of the Port Harcourt - Maiduguri rail line. Port Harcourt port which had been near comatose since the early 2000s has been revived and Onne Port recently hosted the largest vessel ever to berth in Nigerian waters. The major international shipping lines such as Maersk, Comet and General cargo have fully returned to the port, with an average of 1,500 containers every fortnight and over 20,000 MR of cargo monthly.

CREATING A PROFESSIONAL MARITIME SECTOR

Amaechi has been determined to professionalize the maritime sector. He promoted the development of a certification process for freight forwarders created by the Council for the Regulation of Freight Forwarding in Nigeria (CRFFN), to weed out non-professionals and touts from the industry. The professionalization of freight forwarding will improve the ease of doing business in Nigeria, reduce smuggling and enhance service delivery at the ports. The new Diploma in Freight Forwarding and Supply Chain Management has been established as the minimum standard of qualification to be

registered as a freight forwarder in Nigeria. More than 400 persons graduated from this program across 16 accredited tertiary institutions in the country.

To build further capacity in the maritime sector, Amaechi laid the foundation of the Institute of Transport and Logistics at the Gregory University, Uturu in Abia State. The Institute, upon completion, will offer specialised transportation courses and specialised laboratories for Maritime and Oceanography, Aviation/ Aeronautic, Designing and Construction Suites, Aerospace Engineering, Central Machining Tools Centre, Railway Engineering and simulation rooms

MANAGEMENT OF RESOURCES

Before Amaechi took over as Minister of Transportation, the sector was woefully underperforming when it came to revenue generation. Overwhelming corruption in the sector meant that parastatals and agencies in the Ministry were underreporting their income and therefore cheating the central purse. In 2015 when the Buhari Administration came into power, the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA) was remitting less than N19 billion into the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

However, within three years of Amaechi's appointment as Minister of Transportation, NPA remitted N1.02 trillion into the Consolidated Revenue Fund. The Nigerian Maritime Administration and Safety Agency, (NIMASA), another agency under the Ministry Transportation, contributed N43 billion in 2021, compared to N1 to N3 billion annually when Amaechi began his tenure. While the Nigerian Railway Corporation (NRC) generated N1.4 billion in 2020 compared to near zero remittances before 2015.

As Governor of Rivers State, Amaechi increased the internally generated revenue of Rivers State to about N7 billion a month from N2 billion a month when he took office in 2007. He also left the State with just three months of pension arrears after his term, even though he inherited pension arrears of over N4.5 billion. His economic management skills were most tested when the Federal Government suddenly downgraded the State monthly revenue from N20 billion to N13 billion. Despite this, the Administration forged ahead with its plans to provide quality and free education to the masses.

FINANCIAL PROBITY

Amaechi is to be commended for financial management of the projects in his Ministry. He ensured that the loans taken from Chinese banks to develop railway lines were to be paid directly to the contractor in China, not to the Ministry. This automatically eliminated any possibility of corruption or diversion of funds and is the first time that such an arrangement has ever been set up in the Nigerian government. While detractors attacked him for the level of borrowing, (even though such capital intensive projects could be not executed without taking on debt). the fact remains that the Chinese loans represented only 3.94% of Nigeria's total public debt as of March 2020. Furthermore, he negotiated concessionary bilateral loans with interest rates of just 2.5% over a 20 year tenor, thereby reducing the burden on the government.

Amaechi believes in transparent government and when he was Governor of Rivers State, he set up the Rivers State Due Process Commission to monitor all State Government procurements and contracts so that the expenditure of government funds was fully accountable. He also ensured that the legislature passed the Public Procurement Law, one of several notable governance and public finance reforms under his Administration.

SUSTAINABILITY

Sustainability is always baked into any project that Amaechi spearheads. He champions knowledge transfer, local content and always considers the economic and social and governance (ESG) impact of every project. Examples include:

As Minister of Transportation:

- Ensuring the overwhelming use of local materials and manpower in railway construction
- Convincing the Chinese railway contractor CCEC to establish a Wagon Assembly Plant in Kajola to make Nigeria self-sufficient in production of wagons, locomotives and other rail rolling stocks
- Securing the establishment of a \$50 Million Transportation University in Katsina built for free by the Chinese, as well as a Multidisciplinary University in Rivers State and the training of 150 Nigerian students in Chinese Universities on railway engineering so that they can eventually take over from the Chinese
- Ensuring that every contract comes with an iron-clad maintenance contract

As Governor:

- Establishment of the Rivers State Sustainable Development Agency in 2007, a structured intervention programme with the mandate to impact the people of Rivers State through initiatives such as the provision of infrastructure, skills development, job creation and human capital development
- Signing into law a social service levy to be paid by all employed and self-employed residents of Rivers State. The funds from this levy were pooled to fund the free education programs, improvements in medical facilities and other essential social services

Governor Amaechi's vision was of providing international quality education in the state and ensuring that quality education is not restricted to the privileged members of the society. The admission into the school would be based strictly on merit, irrespective of the candidates' social background, adding that equal number of spaces would be allocated to the 23 local government areas.

Concern for the poor has been Amaechi's biggest motivating factor ever since he entered political life more than two decades ago. Throughout his political career, he has focused on creating policies and executing projects that will enhance the welfare of the most economically vulnerable in society.





Examples of this include:

As Minister:

- Mandating the contractor of Dala Dry Port to build a primary school as part of their CSR and to provide free education to children in that area
- Ignoring the calls from several quarters to repay construction loans by increasing the ticket prices on the Abuja-Kaduna rail route. As he said to reporters, "If we increase the cost of the tickets, what about the poor man that wants to move from Abuja to Kaduna? - Establishing the social service levy to pool funds from all Rivers State citizens to fund social welfare projects

Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi has had a profound and lasting legacy of job creation, both from his time as Governor and through his office as Minister. He has long championed the idea of infrastructure development not only as a tool for economic growth but as a powerful vehicle for employment.

As Governor, he leveraged infrastructure development to create jobs in Rivers State. The huge projects he executed to revamp the education, health and urban infrastructure of Rivers State generated tens of thousands of direct and indirect jobs. He employed 13200 teachers in Rivers State, 7000 health workers and more than 600 medical doctors. He also created job opportunities through agricultural development, employing 2,000 young people to learn new farming methods on the Songhai Rivers Initiative Farm, setting up banana farms which employed another 2,000 people and revitalizing Risonpalm which employed 5,000 youth. He is also spearheading innovative approaches such as the Integrated National Security and Waterways Protection Infrastructure, known as the Deep Blue Project.

The Deep Blue Project is designed to protect Nigerian territorial waters and the Gulf of Guinea from piracy and other maritime crimes. It involves the acquisition of assets, such as fast intervention vessels, surveillance aircraft, and other facilities, including a command and control centre for data collection and information sharing, as well as training of personnel from the security services to man the assets.
